Gems From Genesis “By the Word of the Lord”

According to the evolutionary paradigm, it took millions of years of trial and error to “create” everything in the universe; but the Bible tells us a very different story – God spoke, and it was done! Notice how often words referring to speech are used in Genesis 1. (“God said,” vs. 3, 6, 9, 11, 14, 20, 24, 26, 29; “God called,” vs. 5, 8, 10; “God blessed,” vs. 22, 28.) This truth is affirmed throughout Scripture. Note the following examples (bold added for emphasis):

“By the **word of the LORD** were the heavens made; and all the host of them by the breath of his mouth. ... For he spake, and it was done; he commanded and it stood fast.” (Ps. 33: 6, 9)

“Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the **word of God** ...” (Heb. 11:3)

“... by the **word of God** the heavens were of old, and the earth standing out of the water and

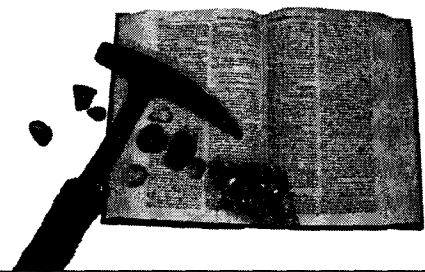
*in the water: Whereby the world that then was, being overflowed with water, perished. But the heavens and the earth, which are now, by the same **word** are kept in store, reserved unto fire against the day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men.”* (II Peter 3:5-7)

So we see, our world was created and is being kept by the active, authoritative word of God. What power there in is His word! But the word of God is not just sound waves moving through the air – nor is it just ink on a page. The Word is a Person – living and active:

“God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son ... by whom also he made the worlds ...” (Heb. 1:1-2)

“In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by him; and without him was not anything made that was made. And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us ...” (John 1:1-3, 14)

The Word is still speaking – still creating “new creatures in Christ” (II Cor 5:17); still “upholding all things by the word of His power” (Heb 1:3); still leading His flock (John 10:27-28), teaching, correcting, reproving, training in righteousness (II Tim 3:16), and cleansing from sin (Eph 5:26). Oh, that He would open our ears to hear Him more clearly – as we gaze at a beautiful sunrise, as we meditate on the words written on the pages of our Bibles, and as we wait for His still small voice speaking deep in our hearts. May we like Samuel say, “Speak; for thy servant heareth.” (I Sam 4:10) **T&B**

Molecular Machines

We can certainly be thankful to God for the splendor of His Creation, the majestic mountains, His fascinating birds and animals, and His bountiful provision in our lives. But God also takes care of the things we can't even see. Though atheists don't want to give God the credit and thank Him, His handiwork is revealed in every living cell. Even in "micro-science," He deserves our thanks and praise!

Modern microscopes have revealed wonderful little machines called "molecular machines," or "molecular motors." They are found inside each cell of every living thing, and their moving parts are made up of molecules shaped to fit together. They do much of the work of every cell. Most people who want to "fire" their Creator don't yet know about molecular machines, but cells can't live without them.

Every machine we know of had an intelligent designer, but the tiny molecular machines are outstanding. They are so precise and efficient that scientists working in *nanotechnology*, the field of the very small, hope to be able to copy some of them.

Best known is a miniature motor which spins at 100,000 rpm's with almost perfect efficiency. Like a boat motor, it propels its owner, a single cell, through the water. [Discussed in an earlier issue of *Think & Believe*]

Not even simple machines pop into existence on their own. Since machines are only made by intel-

ligent craftsmen, the presence of machines in all cells shows that cells had an intelligent origin. Scientists are discovering molecular machines in large numbers, but we only have space here for two striking examples.

Molecular Pumps

Cells would just be loose "goo" dissolving into the water if they were not enclosed by membranes.

That presents a problem: Even the simplest cell must have nutrients if it is to live, and nutrients are too large to pass through a cell's membrane. God's solution: the membranes of even the simplest cells contain machines: little pumps made out of several different proteins folded into complex shapes to work together. They pass the right nutrients through the membrane and into the cell. A cell without machines that pass nutrients through its membrane would starve to death.

These pumps, like all molecular machines, are made according to the intelligent plans included in the cell's information. Because pumps that recognize and pass nutrients into the cell don't and can't happen by accident, their presence destroys the theory that the first cell was put together by chemicals with no intelligent input!

Molecular Unwinding Machines and Reproduction

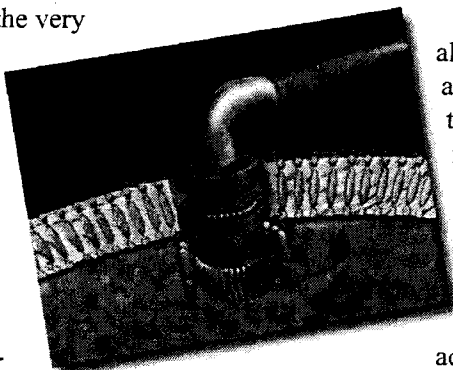
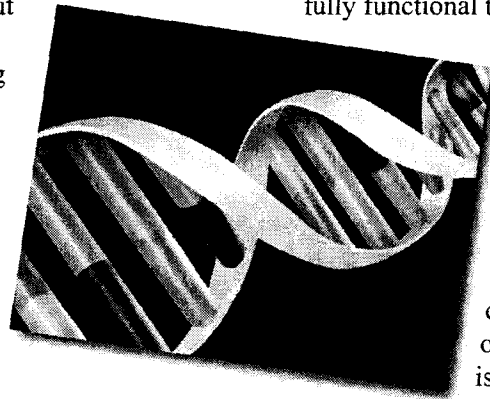
Another reason life could not have

been spontaneously generated without a Creator is that each cell must have a way to reproduce. If the "first cell" did not have this ability already fully functional there could never

have been a second cell! After one generation, new life would have become no life.

In reproduction, when a cell divides, one copy of a cell's DNA is passed on to its offspring. One of

the reasons this is not easy is that the DNA's two strands are long, thin, and tightly twisted together like the strands of a rope. The DNA strands must be separated one from the other at cell division to give one strand to each cell. How does one strand get separated from the other when they are long, and twisted tightly together? Among a number of machines necessary for reproduction are DNA unwinding machines. If these and other machines that promote cell division had not already been in place, no "first cell" could ever have produced a second cell. **T&B**



*These are just a couple examples of the many complex molecular machines that had to be operating at the same time for a "first cell" to live! Since no machine has ever been known to pop into existence without a creator, the required presence of many of them is powerful evidence for an intelligent Creator. The impact of this evidence grows as new machines are discovered every year. In the next issue of *Think & Believe*, Dr. Heinze will share more.*
