


"On Day 6 of Creation Week (Gen. 1:26) God said, 'Let us make man in our image ...'. However, Genesis 2:7 shows that God made man very special – He actually 'formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul.'


"There are even more tiny particles and it

"Dad, I am not sure I know what you mean by the word vibration," Mary said.


"Think about it this way, Mary," answered Mr. Jones. "When you hit a key

on the piano, a hammer hits a wire that begins to shake or vibrate. A tightly strung wire will shake at a different speed than a more loosely strung wire. The vibrations made from a piano are at a frequency that our ears can pick up and recognize as sound. The ear will hear a high tone from a tight wire and a lower tone from a looser wire. When we speak, our vocal cords shake or vibrate in such a way that sounds are made. There are many other vibrations that are outside of our hearing range, therefore we cannot hear them. For example light basically comes from the vibration of energy particles called photons.

"I believe that in Genesis 1:3 where it reads 'And God said, Let there be light ...' that God, through the powerful vibrating sounds of His spoken word created the particles of energy that make up light!

"One of my favorite Bible verses is found in Psalm33:6-9; 'By the word of the LORD were the heavens made; and all the host of them by the breath of his mouth. ... For he spake, and it was done; he commanded, and it stood fast.' From the power of God's spoken word the energy that makes up all of Creation was created. He spoke and it was!" concluded Mr. Jones.
