

# NOTES & QUOTES

■ Did you feel the shock waves generated when the school board in a small Colorado community invited us to give a strictly scientific lecture on creation/evolution at an assembly for their students? You would have thought we'd been given permission to tie the students up and force them to bow down before a Bible. The invitation was withdrawn when the district was falsely told it was illegal and a lawsuit was threatened, even though **parents and students wanted the seminar** and students were given the opportunity to "opt out." Who controls local school districts anyway? Obviously not parents and local school boards.

■ A letter received by one of our readers gives some insight as to what's happening in the schools. The letter, dated September 1993, was written on National Center for Science Education stationery and addressed, "Dear Fellow AAA [American Anthropological Association] Member." It moans:

According to a number of recent polls, less than half of our fellow citizens accept the idea that evolution took place, and in a September, 1993 Gallup poll, *fully 47% of them believe that human beings were specially created about 10,000 years ago.* [Praise the Lord!]

■ It states that "vocal opponents of evolution" are "having a great deal of success at getting creationism into the curriculum, and/or getting evolution out." (Funny thing, it seems to us just the opposite is taking place.) The letter then lists instances where creationists have supposedly "wormed" their way in. One is particularly interesting:

In Washington state, a school allowed a group of high school students to "opt out" of biology class because they were offended when the teacher "taught evolution as a fact". [Ed. Academic freedom? **Everybody** has to learn evolution, but even those who are **interested** can't hear anything else.]

■ The letter is very open about the agenda of the NCSE. While claiming that NCSE is "religiously neutral," it states:

The National Center for Science Education, Inc., is the nonprofit organization that sponsored the Committees of Correspondence that were so effective in combatting creation science in the early 1980's.

■ It goes on to tout the work of NCSE:

What has NCSE done? In addition to supporting grass-roots efforts to combat creationism through its "hot line" and other services, NCSE

\* has worked with state agencies to be sure that evolution is included in state curricula;

\* has worked with publishers to be sure evolution is not left out of the textbooks;

\* has worked with publishers to provide them with scientific expertise for pre-publication science content review;

\* has worked with national teacher organizations to improve pre-college teachers' understanding of evolution;

\* has even produced its first two classroom videotapes on evolution.

■ The letter ends by soliciting members and donations. It is signed by Jane Buikstra, Former President, AAA. On the enclosed card, it says, "Here is my donation to keep evolution in our science classes." Why do they want donations? They tell you clearly in the letter:

**But the heart of NCSE is to provide the all-important expertise needed to keep evolution in the classroom and keep "scientific" creationism out. [Bold added.]**

■ Recognize the tactic? Evolution is presented as **science**, while creation is declared to be religion. It's the same old game plan we've seen many times. Remember the statement by L. Harrison Matthews in the Forward to the 1971 edition of Darwin's **Origin of Species**:

Belief in evolution is thus exactly parallel to belief in special creation -- both are concepts which believers know to be true, but neither up to the present, has been capable of proof.

■ Evolution is **not** a strictly scientific theory. It cannot be "proven" scientifically but must be accepted by faith. It is the foundational tenet of atheism and secular humanism--the dominant faith presented in our schools today. **Our schools have not "gotten rid of religion," they have simply changed religions.**

■ We recently talked with a pastor who ministered in Russia. He asked some top Russian scientists what it was that led their country into atheism -- was it Marx, Lenin, Stalin. They answered, "No, these men were mere politicians. What led to atheism was the widespread acceptance of the theory of evolution." Hearing that gave us a sick feeling in our stomachs, especially knowing what's going on in our schools today. **This is not just an interesting scientific debate -- it is a major spiritual battle. Our children are being held captive and brainwashed by evolutionary indoctrination, but we are determined to go forward in God's might, speaking wherever He leads.** Will you join with us in prayer and support of this important work?

# SPOTLIGHT ON SCIENCE

## Human Fossils: Why So Few?

People often ask us why so few human fossils are found in lower rock layers. Several explanations can be given, but the most detailed model we know about was presented by John Woodmorappe in Creation Science Research Quarterly (Volume 20, December, 1983, pp. 167-171). Though it cannot be "proven" since it deals with past events, it offers some interesting possibilities. A summary of his article follows.

Woodmorappe begins with the "lack" of human fossils. He notes that significant numbers of human fossils in lower layers have been reported, but most are disputed or ignored by evolutionists. Others have probably been mis-identified, mis-interpreted or simply left unidentified, either intentionally or unintentionally because they don't "fit" with the prevailing evolutionary bias. Thus, there may be more than we think.

Woodmorappe argues fossil human remains are not too prevalent, though, because the pre-Flood human population was probably fairly low. He notes that Whitcomb and Morris, in The Genesis Flood (1961, pp. 273-275), had suggested a population of 1 billion, based on the assumption of 6 surviving-reproducing children per generation. Woodmorappe obtains only 10 million by dropping this number to 4.6. He notes that though animals had been created in **populations**, only two humans were created. He also argues that the pre-Flood reproductive rate was probably fairly low due to rampant homosexual, zoophilic and pedophilic behavior, as well as promiscuous heterosexual behavior, rampant venereal disease and widespread use of contraceptives by women interested only in external beauty. In addition, he suggests that there was probably a high murder rate, widespread infanticide and child sacrifice. These factors combined would lead to a relatively low population. He backs up these suggestions with the idea that a merciful God would surely have withheld the Flood if any significant percentage of the population was not totally depraved.

Using this assumption and estimates of the amount of Phanerozoic rock in the earth's crust, Woodmorappe calculates the concentration of fossils likely. He arrives at the conclusion that even if human fossils were uniformly distributed, there would only be one specimen per 70 cubic kilometers of rock. That's a big haystack in which to find a needle! Since fossils are not uniformly distributed, though, he makes another calculation. Assuming that **all** 10 million remains were concentrated in only 1 million cubic kilometers, he finds that there would still be only 10 specimens per cubic

kilometer, and the chance that any cubic kilometer is one of the "special" ones would be only 1 in 700. Again, the chances of an intrepid fossil hunter finding these specimens would be exceedingly small.

Woodmorappe goes on to present a model of pre-Flood population distribution and early Flood events. He suggests that the human population centers would have been situated near rivers, as in most ancient civilizations, to facilitate transport and trade. Dense forests probably made land travel extremely difficult.

As the "windows of heaven" opened and the "great fountains of the deep" broke open, the run-off would rapidly swell rivers to flood stage. At this stage there would be little or no flood-plain deposition. Some of the people and their implements might have gotten buried in river delta deposition, but most probably floated on out to sea where their bodies decomposed or were eaten by scavengers. Their bones were scattered and probably decomposed rapidly.

This possible explanation for the scarcity of human fossils in "old" rock doesn't paint a pretty picture of God's judgment during the time of the Flood, but judgment isn't pretty. Woodmorappe bases his arguments on the Biblical fact that "wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually." (Gen.6:5) Certainly today's widespread warfare, violence, abortion, homosexuality and euthanasia must try God's patience. The Bible warns that judgment again is near. What are we going to do? Fortunately, we have an "ark" of safety. Acts 16:31 says "...believe on the Lord Jesus Christ , and thou shalt be saved, ..." Do you?
