Reflections on My Internship at AOI

I must admit that when I agreed to become an intern for Alpha Omega Institute, I had no idea of what I was getting myself into. I'd only known the Nuttings and the Johnsons for all of five days when I agreed to spend six weeks with them. But, truth be told, I'd do it all over again. My internship was a wonderful, growing time, both spiritually and mentally. The six weeks passed in a blur of setting up and tearing down, learning to use puppets, reading, reading, and more reading, traveling, meeting many new people, being "stretched," as Dave called it, talking with Eugene (the famous Lion puppet), and so many other things.

During my stay in Colorado, I traveled with the ministry team on two road trips. During the first trip, I spent my time in Durango, Colorado, just learning the ropes. I had no idea that so much went into a creation ministry. I was just trying to answer at least some of the questions I was fielding as I worked the book table. By the end of the second road trip, I'd graduated to actually talking to Eugene (the puppet). All I can say is that he took good care of

me, though he wasn't exactly cooperative all the time.

Between the road trips, I spent my time studying or at the Alpha Omega Institute. I met Dorothy and Donna, two women who I came to enjoy very much and saw how the resource center was set up and run. I was even able to help Dorothy a little as she worked on setting up the library. Not that internship was all work and no play. I had my share of fun. I was able to see some of the sights in Colorado, get in a hike and go rappelling for the first time.

My internship impressed me with the importance of being able to give a Biblical answer to questions of origins.

Christianity becomes nothing more than a nice, sometimes respectable, but powerless, pastime if there isn't a Creator God. Spotlight On Science

Antarctic Fish with Antifreeze!

Think of how many times we have said, "It sure is cold this winter. Global warming nothing--it isn't happening here!" Sometimes it would seem our blood is ready to freeze in our veins. So we crank up the heat in the house and head for the auto store to get extra antifreeze for the car. We throw extra blankets on the bed and snuggle in with a good issue of **Think & Believe** for comfort! Bears hibernate in their dens and other animals put on thicker fur coats, but what do the fish do to cope with the frigid Antarctic water? We might think they are cold-blooded and since the water isn't going to freeze, they won't. However, they are in saltwater that is actually colder than normal freezing temperature. So how do they survive without the water in their blood freezing?

National Geographic (June, 1995) had a short article by Boris Weintraub about antifreeze in Antarctic fish. He stated:

The fish that thrive off the Antarctic coast in frigid 28°F water survive the same way a car does in a North Dakota winter: with antifreeze. But a little fish antifreeze could keep your motor purring for a long time. It's 300 times as effective per molecule as the ethylene glycol in a car radiator.

... there are almost a hundred species of fish called notothenioids, ranging from six-inch zooplankton feeders to six-foot toothfish. They swim at all depths, from the 3,200-foot-deep bottom to the surface. Notothenioids produce their antifreeze, a glycoprotein, in the liver. They secrete it into the bloodstream, where it fills spaces around cells ... Although seawater with ice crystals gets into the fish's blood, the antifreeze stops the ice from growing, and eventually it is filtered out.

This is **better antifreeze than we use** in our most cherished autos. It sounds like an ingeniously designed system reflecting the creative talent of our God. To an evolutionist, millions of years of gradual changes operating with natural selection produced the perfect blend of antifreeze. Which appears more logical?

Ants and *Antifreeze*!

Pun intended, but ants really do produce antifreeze, too! Yep, it gets cold out there in the ground under a blanket of snow. Since the ants don't have their own central heating systems, they need to have a way to keep from freezing during the winter. So the colder it gets, the more antifreeze is actually produced.

Did this ability happen by chance over millions of years by mutation and natural selection as our evolutionist friends would claim? Scientists have long studied ants that live in the equatorial zones where it is nice and warm year round. They found that these ants do not produce antifreeze like their cousins do in Indi"ant"apolis, Indiana. The evolutionist were quick to point this out. "See," they said, "this shows that this ability to produce antifreeze came about by mutation and natural selection. Since they certainly didn't **need** antifreeze, they didn't **need** to evolve that characteristic."

Some explanations such as this one sound really great, at first. However, researchers shot a big hole in the original theory shortly after it was suggested. Ants from the equatorial zone which they thought did not have the ability to produce antifreeze were transported to the northern latitude. **Within the first year**, they all of a sudden began producing antifreeze. You might say, "Wow! That's fast evolution!" The truth is that the ants had already possessed the genetic ability to produce the proper antifreeze chemicals.

Is this "pre-evolution" as some might suggest? Very doubtful! Perhaps, as others would theorize, these ants lived where it was colder at one time, evolved the complicated antifreeze system, and somehow over the millions of years of living in the warm zone did not lose the ability to produce antifreeze. I believe a better explanation is that they were pre-programmed by their Creator with ability to handle many possible situations. Just like a dog grows a thicker winter coat in years it is going to be very cold, so do ants produce antifreeze before it is needed! We really believe God takes care of his creatures. Think about it! If he cares for the ant, and cares for the fish in the sea, don't you think He cares for you and me! **We serve a wonderful God!** Tell others about Him!

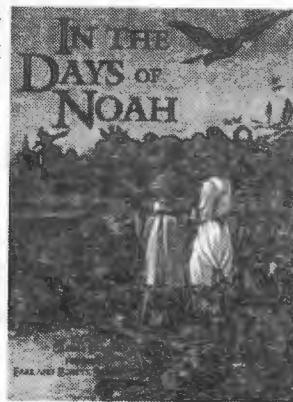
