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SURVIVAL STRATEGIES

It seems wherever we go we hear heartbreaking stories of young people who have grown up in Christian homes, but turned away in high school or college. The stories are amazingly similar -- young people, often active in church during their early teen years, have been influenced by professors who tear apart the Bible and the Christian faith. Evolution is presented as a proven fact, the Bible is ridiculed, and those who hold to a Biblical world view are portrayed as stupid, old-fashioned and very naive. **How tragic** that these students never knew there were indeed good answers for the professors' arguments.

How can we prepare our children for the onslaught of persuasive and often deceptive teaching of those who hold an anti-Christian world view? **We must realize from the start that we are in a spiritual battle for the hearts and minds of our children.** Consequently, the first thing we must do is **pray!** Then, we should demonstrate to them a humble respect for God's Wisdom and a healthy doubt of man's speculation. We can show them the fallacies in the systems that oppose God's Wisdom and exalt man's, and we can teach them to rely on the Holy Spirit to help them discern the truth.

It is also imperative that we teach our youth to deal with issues at the foundational level. While we can, and should teach them to recognize and be able to refute many of the arguments presented to them, we must realize that we will never be able to teach them the detailed answers to all the questions they may face. However, we can teach them to weigh the arguments against proven Godly logic. We can encourage them to ask questions and seek answers when they struggle with doubts and fears. We can give them a well-reasoned defense for the faith, but also help them to

see, that while we don't have **all** the answers, we have enough to warrant placing our faith in God and His Word. It is important that they understand that those who oppose us have far fewer answers!

In order to accomplish these objectives, **we must spend time communicating with our children**, talking with them about all kinds of issues facing them, and helping them to think in a godly way, "earnestly contending for the faith." (Jude 3) In doing this, they will gain practice in evaluating and thinking things through, and we can help them see how God's wisdom applies to every kind of situation. We cannot leave it to the Sunday School teacher, the youth leader, or the pastor; we must make it our practice to do this "when we sit in our house and when we walk by the way and when we lie down and when we rise up (Deut. 6:7)"

May God grant us His grace, that our children will walk in His ways and serve Him with all their heart.

■ Paul Taylor's **The Illustrated Origins Answer Book** (1989) is a concise compilation of evidences including sections on the origin of life and the universe, "cavemen," as well as information on the age of the earth, and the fossil record. Australian medical doctor and molecular biologist, Michael Denton, does not claim to be a "creationist," yet he very effectively demolishes the theory of evolution. Loan this one to teachers, doctors, scientists, or other "educated" skeptics. Maybe then they'll be more open to reading **What is Creation Science?** (\$20.00)

■ Children also need well-written books with a Biblical perspective. The following selections are informative and beautifully-illustrated --excellent for children of all ages including adults.

■ Our newest children's book, **Destination: Moon**, (1989) was written by Astronaut James Irwin shortly before his death. It contains spectacular photographs and the fascinating story of his astronaut training and exciting trip to the moon. Irwin's creation perspective and faith in God is very evident throughout. ■ Most children (and adults) are confused about dinosaurs and how they fit with the Bible. **The Great Dinosaur Mystery and the Bible** by Paul Taylor (1989) and **Dinosaurs and the Bible** by Dave Unfred are the books to get! (\$11.00 each)

SPOTLIGHT ON SCIENCE

Palm Trees

Jesus often used common, everyday objects or familiar plants and animals in His teaching. The more we understand about the plants and animals, the more likely it is that we will be able to learn from them.

The palm tree is quite common in many parts of the world. What lessons can be learned from it? The Bible tells us, "The righteous shall flourish like the palm tree ... (Psalm 92:12)." How do palm trees flourish? How can we be like palm trees as we live righteously?

Palm Trees Can Withstand Abuse. While the hearts of ordinary trees are dead, the heart of the palm tree is alive. Because the life of the palm tree is on the inside, outward abuse does not affect its life or quality of fruit. "...though our outward man perish, yet the inward man is renewed day by day (II Corinthians 4:16)." It might be well to ask ourselves, How well do we withstand abuse? Do we live a consistent life and bear fruit regardless of the outward circumstances, because of the life within? Christ living in us makes it possible.

Palm Trees Can Endure Storms. Strong winds will break ordinary trees. The palm tree will bow to the ground and spring back when the winds have passed. Ordinary leaves collect wind, but wind cannot "grab hold" of palm leaves. "Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time (I Peter 5:6)." Do we bend without breaking as we encounter the difficulties of life? Do we endure storms by humbling ourselves, realizing that God is in control, and submitting to His will for our lives?

Palm Trees Can Survive Drought. Each palm root is the same size at its stem and its base; therefore, it cannot be pulled up easily. Because palm trees send their roots deep into the ground, they are able to tap resources of nourishment that are not available on the surface. Ordinary roots taper and branch -- each palm root is thick and strong. "...Take root downward, and bear fruit upward (Isaiah 37:31)." How are our roots? Are they growing deep, finding a strong anchoring spot in God's Word? Are they deep enough to tap hidden resources even during times of drought?

The Older a Palm Tree Grows, the Sweeter its Fruit Becomes. Ordinary fruit trees diminish their yield as they grow older. Palm trees do not bear fruit until they mature, a process sometimes requiring up to fifty years. As palm trees age, their fruit grows sweeter. A tree with a sleek trunk gives ordinary fruit

while one with a scarred trunk gives sweeter fruit. "They shall still bring forth fruit in old age; they shall be fat [healthy] and flourishing (Psalm 92:114)." Are we trusting God to bring us to maturity? Too many people grow bitter as they are scarred by the circumstances of life. How about us? Is the fruit of our lives hard and bitter, or is it "growing sweeter and sweeter" as the years go by?

Palm trees are a welcome sight to weary desert travellers. Since they must have their roots in water to survive, palm trees announce the presence of water and shelter in a dry and thirsty land. Likewise, we too must be "rooted" in Christ, the living water. Then our lives will be a beacon to weary people thirsting for the refreshing, life-giving water in a dry and hostile world.

By God's grace, may each of us flourish like the palm tree. May we patiently withstand abuse because of the life of Christ inside. May we endure the storms of life as we humble ourselves and submit to God's will for our lives. May we sink our roots deep in His word that we may endure periods of hardship and drought. And may the fruit of our lives grow sweeter and sweeter, the longer we walk with the Lord.
