by the Johnsons in Creation and Children's Ministry. Praise God, they have now begun to venture out to minister without their mentors!


Adam and Angel Habluetzel, our latest team players (see page 2), have a heart for university ministry and plan to join

members. Adam spent 20 years in young adult/youth ministry after Christ transformed his own life as a teenager. He loves to see this same eternal change in the young people he helps disciple.

Angel has mentored high school and college-aged women and excels in the gifts of helps and administration. They share a passion for teaching Biblical worldview and apologetics, including Biblical creation, the Flood of Noah,

logic, reasoning, and the dangers of unexamined assumptions.

When asked why a Biblical worldview, especially concerning

We have found that most young people have bought into an evolutionary, old-

earth foundation for their worldview without even consciously choosing it – even kids raised in the Church. When taught an alternative view from Genesis, backed with scientific evidence, many of those students have an 'aha' experience that opens

their eyes to the validity of the Bible and strengthens their faith tremendously. For many nonbelieving students, the issue of origins can stand as a huge roadblock to taking Christianity seriously. Conversely, hearing a young-earth-creation take on origins can start them down a path toward genuine faith!"

They are excited to "get boots on the ground" with AOI's student outreach. We, at AOI, concur wholeheartedly! Biblical Geology 101 by Dr. Robert Carter and Michael Oard

hile studying geology in college, I was confronted daily with concepts framed in millions of years of geologic time. Sometimes, I had professors introduce a topic by saying, "We knew those creationists were wrong decades ago." Then, they would mount a case against the Bible and creationists. This was in a conservative college. But conservative or not, students like me, were (and are even more so today) being indoctrinated by anti-Biblical propaganda. For me, it was too easy to buy into that concept since that is all I had ever heard. At that point in my life, I had no inkling of Biblical Creation, let alone a Biblical perspective of Geology. Today, the same is

true for a high percentage of middle school and high school students or students in virtually


any college course – especially those who study physical science or geology.

However, the exciting thing is that there *is* a Biblical perspective of geology that fits with the scientific data – even better than the longage perspective. Keep in mind, if those "millions of years" of earth history didn't exist, and the Biblical time frame is valid, then the goo-to-you" story of evolution crumbles

since it is totally dependent on vast amounts of time.

Biblical Geology 101 is a very

easy-to-read resource for you and your family. Learn the key concepts of geology and how rocks are formed without having to wade through a bunch of technical jargon or an anti-biblical philosophy. I highly recommend this excellent book. Geology can be fun - especially when you see how it fits with the Flood of Noah's day. You can trust the whole Bible!



The Plant That Ate the South

What is this plant? It climbs over everything – fences; stone walls; telephone poles and electrical lines; sheds and houses; shrubs and trees. It invades and grows rapidly, as much as a foot per day, and its vines can grow to be 100 feet long! Some say you can even "see it grow!"

The Kudzu (*Pueraria lobata*) is an invasive vine that is native to southeast Asia. It was first introduced to North America in 1876 at the Philadelphia Centennial Exposition, but was then destroyed, as per federal law. Later, in 1883, it was re-introduced at the New Orleans Exposition. Initially, it was marketed in the Southeast as an ornamental plant "to shade porches." Later the Soil and Conservation Service promoted it as a great tool for erosion control and the government touted it as excellent cattle fodder.

Later, when the boll weevil infestations and the failure of cotton crops caused many farmers to abandon their farms, Kudzu plants were left unattended and began to grow unchecked. Uncontrolled, Kudzu grows rapidly,

initially by forming dense mats on the ground through runners that can root at the joints. Its roots can penetrate the soil to as much as 12 feet, forming massive tubers

that can weigh 400 pounds! Its mats can anchor and form new roots every foot or so at the nodes. If the vine separates at that node, it can form an entirely new plant, thus encouraging further growth.

When Kudzu begins to climb, its rapid rate of growth continues. Sometimes it seems as if one can actually watch that vine advancing higher and higher! It prefers to invade the edges of forests and can climb 100 feet high into the

trees. It produces a velvet-like covering of leaves that may look attractive. but underneath there is destruction and death. The plants smothered by Kudzu are weakened, branches are broken off, and photosynthesis becomes difficult, if not impossible. Thus, beneficial habitat, with a diversity of understory

plants, is lost for various insects, mammals, and birds.

When the leaves die off after the first frost, the vines, which can

be greater than
one-quarter inch in
diameter, resemble
the tentacles of an
octopus. It reminds
this writer of
mankind's plague
of sin, because it
is so ravenous.
Even its tiny,
half-inch long
reddish-purple

to purple blossoms

remind one of the enchantments and seeming attractiveness of sin.

Why would our Creator God cause such an evil-like plant to exist? Does it have an adversary? Yes, an adversary does exist – an insect called the "Bean Plataspid"

(Megacopta cribraria) which was accidentally introduced some years ago. The problem is that this insect also feeds on important agricultural crops like soybeans and hog peanuts.

So how can one control such an invasive plant like Kudzu? One solution is to rely on cattle, goats, or pigs to graze it. Another solution is to use toxic chemicals to kill it, but such chemicals can also destroy other plants around it.

What about God's role in this matter? Could it be that this is one of many results of the fall of man? See Romans 5:12 and Romans 8:22. Could it also be that God has provided Kudzu as an example of the devastating effects of sin?

Thankfully, though Kudzu remains a perplexing problem, our Creator God has provided the perfect solution at least to **our** problem of sin – the death of His Son, Jesus Christ, on the cross. God graciously provides forgiveness, cleansing, and life eternal for all who put their faith in Him. Have you put your faith in Him? If not, we encourage you to do it today.
