

# Living in a World that's Cursed and Going – Crazy!

Pears ago, our son, Tim, recorded a song with the words: "We're living in a world that's cursed and going crazy." Looking around the world today, those words certainly ring true. Wars, economic woes, pandemic, famines, floods, earthquakes, tsunamis, racial tensions, gender confusion, political strife, religious persecution, and more. Yes, the world seems to be going – crazy! What's happening and what's the answer?

Psalm 11:3 says, "If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" The foundations of society are under attack on so many fronts today. The founders of the United States had a basic belief in God as Creator. They realized that our style of government is only good for a moral and religious people. It has been said: "America is great because she is good. If America ever ceases to be good, she will also cease to be great." Though this statement has often been attributed to Alexis de Toqueville, there is no clear evidence that he actually said it. However, it has been widely quoted. Nevertheless, it is increasingly clear that America has lost its way and needs to return to the founding principles that allowed us to be a beacon of hope and freedom.

So what are these foundations?

To answer that we need to go back to the very beginning, the foundation starting with Genesis 1:1 – "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." At the end of 6 days (yes, real 24-hour days, defined by evening and morning), He looked at His creation and said, "It is **very good**!" (Gen. 1:31) No sin, no sickness, no disease, no death – and perfect fellowship between God and His creation.

Since that is true, what happened? When Satan tempted the first man and woman, they "fell" into sin and all the troubles we see in society began – pain, death, and broken relationships. (See Genesis 3) Over time, wickedness increased and filled the earth (Genesis 6). Finally, God brought the Flood as judgment for this evil. "But Noah found grace in the eyes of the LORD." (Gen 6:8) and through Noah's obedience, mankind was saved. However, even after the Flood, the sad story of corruption continued and is guite evident today. This leads some to wonder, is there any hope?

Fortunately, God, "in the fullness of time, sent forth His Son ..." (Gal 4:4). The angels brought "Good News of great joy,,,in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior, who is Christ [Messiah] the Lord. ... " (Luke 2:10-14) Later, both Jesus and His disciples taught that men should, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" (Repent = turn around, cease to do evil, learn to do good.) But the rulers of Jesus' day rejected the good news and crucified Him.

Thankfully, He defeated death and rose from the grave! Still many refused to believe. "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God ..." (John 1:12) And one day soon, He will come again in power and glory and take His rightful place as King.

Now **that** is good news! That's why we follow Him and celebrate His birth. And it's also why we, at AOI, are working to restore the foundations – the foundational truths of Genesis, Creation, and the Gospel. That's why we continue working to "destroy speculations" (II Cor. 10:5) and anti-God philosophies, including evolutionary

naturalism, (Col. 2:8) and to bring the truth to young and old alike.

of presenting Biblical truth and the scientific evidence to other campus ministries. In a world that will lie to students and manipulate them, the truth certainly does matter and students need to


clearly hear it. Pray with us over the next several months as we, along with Truth Matters, lay more groundwork and offer presentations on relevant creation/worldview topics.
