omeone asked me what book he should send his niece who is heading to a secular university. I was told she knows she will be slammed with evolution since she is required to take several types of science classes. Evolution's Achilles' Heels. It just came out in June of this year! I quickly recommended it.

The Design of Intelligence

If you happen to be hiking through the Zagros mountains between Iran and Iraq, and if you're really patient, you might see a large spider dancing lightly on the rocks. If you look closer, however, you'll notice the spider is being controlled – much like a puppet on a string. The puppet master? ...a completely motionless serpent blending into the rocks. A bird might notice, swoop down, and...BAM! The jaws

snake will snap shut on the bird,

the

inject their poison, and assure the snake of one more meal.

The spider-tailed viper is one of many examples of designed intelligence in the animal kingdom. Not only are its camouflage and structure difficult to explain by natural selection, its intelligent use of these capabilities challenges the notion that evolution is a blind enterprise, primarily dependent on chance. Intelligence indicates intentionality and higher purpose – something men like Charles Darwin and Richard Dawkins denied and actively suppressed.

The mimic octopus, for example, lives in a sandy, relatively structureless environment and must rely on mimicry to survive. By burying all but its two arms in the sand and aligning and undulating them properly, it mimics the deadly sea snake. By grouping its tentacles together and swimming along the bottom, it mimics a banded sole with its poisonous spines. In addition to a crab, (see photo) the mimic

octopus has also been observed to imitate jellyfish, lion fish, sand anemones, mantis shrimp, and stingrays.¹

How does the mimic octopus know what kind of creature to imitate in response to each kind of threat? Moreover, how does it know that it's

doing the imitation correctly?

Even if it was taught this
behavior, how does it
practice? The same goes for
the spider-tailed viper.
How much study
of actual spiders
was required in
order to flick its tail
properly? Just because

it has the structure doesn't guarantee proper execution.

So, what is intelligence and where does it come from? Can you separate it from structure? What good is intelligence if it doesn't match the body it's in?

To explain the origin of human

intelligence, evolutionists will commonly cite an environmental change that forced and/or allowed our supposed ancestors upright stance, the need for tools, or better social interaction. They then postulate that intelligence came along to match that need - much like water flows to fill a void. Greater structure resulted in bigger brains which, by the

way, required wider birth canals. You can thank your great, great grandmothers for being so accommodating. Can you imagine the trials involved in *that* trialand-error process? This may sound like a stretch, (literally) but it stands to reason if you believe everything can, and must be, explained by physical processes.

Yet, intelligence isn't simply the

firing of synapses or reaction of chemicals. Intelligence is integrated with your body yet still posseses self-awareness to think abstractly outside your body. While this is going on, your autonomic nervous system is telling your heart to beat, lungs to breath, etc., and your limbic system is continually gathering and processing information on a whole other complex level.

For the Christian, it seems rather simple. Intelligence, as a component of spirit, is part

of the animating principle of our bodies ultimately tracing its source back to God. James 2:26 states that the body apart from the spirit is dead. A dead body can have all the parts intact to support life, but once the spirit is gone, that's it. While it's true that behavior can be learned and that organisms adjust to new information, that doesn't explain the source of intelligence in the first place.

C.S. Lewis posed a similar argument regarding morality. He believed mankind's sense of moral obligation is one of the greatest evidences of God. Men like Sigmund Freud, however, attribute this to social

conditioning and to environmental pressures – that morality simply benefits survival.

In 1 Cor. 2:14, the apostle Paul stated, "The natural man does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are folly to him,

and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned." While it is reasonable to believe that the origin of abstract realities like intelligence and morality rest in God, reason alone is

not enough. In fact, it can sometimes keep us from God.

God asks us to come to Him by faith and to trust on a spiritual level – to go beyond the control reason offers and seek Him relationally. Heb.11:6 says, "...without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is and that He is a rewarder of those who seek Him."

the last few years. Here is what we keep coming back to: We feel God is leading us to train those who really see the need for Creation ministry and desire to dig deeper. This can take a few routes:


1. Someone may want to actively participate in Creation ministry as a vocation. This could be in your own area. You would not need to move.
